100th Day Activities

Lesson Plan for *The 100th Day of School*
Grade 1

Objective

To help students identify the differences between a text and a video about the 100th Day of School.

Things Needed

- *The 100th Day of School* book
- Access to “The 100th Day of School” web page on the Pop! website:

Before the Activity

Read *The 100th Day of School* out loud to students. Open “The 100th Day of School” web page in your internet browser. Pull up the “Explore Links” tab and click on the PBS Learning Media website, “The 100th Day of School.”

Activity

To start, review activities classes might do to celebrate the 100th Day of School. Students should use the text and images in Chapter 3 (“Making Collections”) and Chapter 4 (“Celebrations”) to answer the following question:

- What are some activities that people do to celebrate the 100th Day of School? (Possible Answers: Students can collect 100 things, such as pebbles, paper clips, or pencils; students can learn a new song; students can practice using the number 100; etc.)



Then, watch the video on “The 100th Day of School” web page. Ask students the following question:

- What new information did the video share about how people can celebrate the holiday? (Possible Answers: Students can run the 100-yard dash; students can create jewelry from 100 beads; students can answer 100 questions; students can write poems using just 100 letters; students can learn about what life was like 100 years ago; etc.)

Evaluation

Could students answer questions about the 100th Day of School activities based on the information in the book? Could they identify the similarities and differences between the book and the video?

Standards

This lesson plan may be used to address the Common Core State Standards’ reading standards for informational texts, grade 1 (RI 1.6).
