Celebrating Love

Lesson Plan for *Valentine's Day*Grade 1

Objective

To help students identify the reasons the author gives to support points in the text and practice participating in group discussions.

Things Needed

- Valentine's Day book
- Whiteboard

Before the Activity

Read Valentine's Day out loud to students.

Activity

Turn to page 6 in *Valentine's Day*. The book says, "Valentine's Day . . . is a day to celebrate love." Ask students to use Chapter 2 ("Secret Love") and Chapter 4 ("Celebrations") to individually think about why the author makes that statement. After a minute or two, have students pair up and talk to each other about their answers. Then, have the students come back together as a class to discuss their answers. Write their answers on the whiteboard. Possible answers could include:

- Valentine helped people marry in secret (p. 12).
- People spend time with loved ones on Valentine's Day (p. 18).
- People do nice things for each other (p. 19).
- People celebrate the holiday by giving each other gifts such as candy or cards (p. 20).

Then, ask students to individually think of a time someone did something nice for them. What are other examples of nice things people can do for each other? After a minute or two, have students pair up and talk to each other about their answers. Then, have the students come back together as a class to discuss their answers. Write their answers on the whiteboard.



Evaluation

Could students use the text to answer the question about Valentine's Day? Could students participate in small and large group discussions?
