

Up In the Clouds

This diagram illustrates the classification of clouds based on their altitude. It is divided into three horizontal sections: High Clouds, Middle Clouds, and Low Clouds.

- High Clouds:**
 - Cirrocumulus:** Represented by a high, thin layer of small, white, rounded cloud puffs.
 - Cirrus:** Represented by a high, thin layer of white, wispy clouds.

 - Cumulonimbus:** A large, towering white cloud with a dark base, extending from the low cloud layer up into the high cloud layer.
