The Truth About Bike Safety

Lesson Plan for *Bike Safety*

Grade 1

Objective

To help students recall key details from a text read aloud to determine if a statement is true or false.

Things Needed

- *Bike Safety* book
- The Truth About Bike Safety worksheet (attached)
- Pens or pencils

Before the Activity

Print one copy of the worksheet for each student. Hand out the worksheets and make sure each student has a pen or pencil.

Activity

Instruct students to listen carefully while you read the *Bike Safety* book aloud. They should circle true or false to answer the questions on the worksheet as you read. After you finish reading, go over the answers together as a class. For each question, invite a volunteer to share his or her answer with the class. Then, use the attached answer key to help the class work together to determine whether this answer is correct. As you go through the questions, have each student correct his or her worksheet. Students can put a star by each correct answer and cross out any incorrect answers.

Evaluation

Collect the worksheets at the end of the activity. Did students answer and score the questions correctly?
