# **Dingo Details**

Lesson Plan for *Dingoes* Grade 1

## Objective

To help students compare and contrast the descriptions of dingoes in a book and an online source.

## Things Needed

- Dingoes book
- Access to the "Dingoes" web page on the Pop! website: https://popbooksonline.com/desert-animals/dingoes

## **Before the Activity**

Read the *Dingoes* book out loud to students. Open the "Dingoes" web page in your internet browser and click on the "Watch a Video" tab.

## Activity

Watch the video and read the caption as a class. Then ask the following questions:

- What do people sometimes call dingoes? (Answer: wild dogs)
- Based on what you saw in the video, how are dingoes similar to pet dogs? (Sample Answers: Dingoes look similar to pet dogs. Dingoes run on four legs like dogs.)
- According to the caption, how are pet dogs and dingoes different? (Answer: Dingoes have always been wild.)
- What does the video show us about a dingo's habitat? (Sample Answers: There are a few bushes but not much grass. There is a lot of dry, reddish soil.)
- How does this compare to the information we read in the *Dingoes* book? (Answer: The book says dingoes live in the desert [p. 4]. Deserts are dry, with few plants.)
- In the video, what colors are the dingoes and their habitat? (Answer: The soil and the dingoes' fur are reddish. The bushes are green.)
- What did the book say about a dingo's color? (Answer: A dingo's color matches the desert. This helps the dingo blend in and makes it hard for prey to see it [p. 12].)



#### Evaluation

Could students recall what information came from the video, what was in the caption, and how both related to what they learned in the book?

#### Standards

This lesson plan may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational texts, grade 1 (RI 1.1, 1.6, 1.9).
