Lesson Plan for *Rattlesnakes* Grade 1

Objective

To help students practice using and defining words related to rattlesnakes.

Things Needed

- Rattlesnakes book
- Word Rattle worksheet (attached)

Before the Activity

Print out a worksheet for each student, or email the worksheet to students. Then read the *Rattlesnakes* book out loud as a class.

Activity

Rattlesnakes are amazing animals. The Word Rattle worksheet includes several sentences about their bodies and behavior. Students should use the word bank to fill the blank in each sentence. If they get stuck, they can look back through the book for clues.

Evaluation

Use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, for up to 8 points.
